

## Tips for avoiding parking tickets

**It is important to know the places where you are prohibited from parking by state law. These locations are typically unsigned.**

1. Parking or standing on sidewalk.
2. Wrong Direction.
3. No parking within 30 feet of stop signs and or yield signs.
4. No parking within 30 feet of signalized intersections.
5. No parking within 20 feet of marked crosswalks.
6. No parking within 15 feet of fire hydrants.
7. No parking within 5 feet of a driveway.
8. No parking within 10 feet of alley entrances.
9. No parking for more than 48 consecutive hours in the same location.
10. Handicapped Parking

- 1. No Parking or standing on sidewalk.** It is illegal to park on a sidewalk, parkway or crosswalk. It is illegal, in part, because your vehicles maybe impeding the ability of a person in a wheel chair to travel without difficulty on the sidewalk.



2. **Wrong direction.** It is illegal to park in the direction opposite to the traffic flow.



3. **No parking within 30 feet of stop signs and or yield signs.** Parking is prohibited within 30 feet to improve the visibility of the sign and to allow pedestrians and vehicles approaching the intersection adequate sightlines.



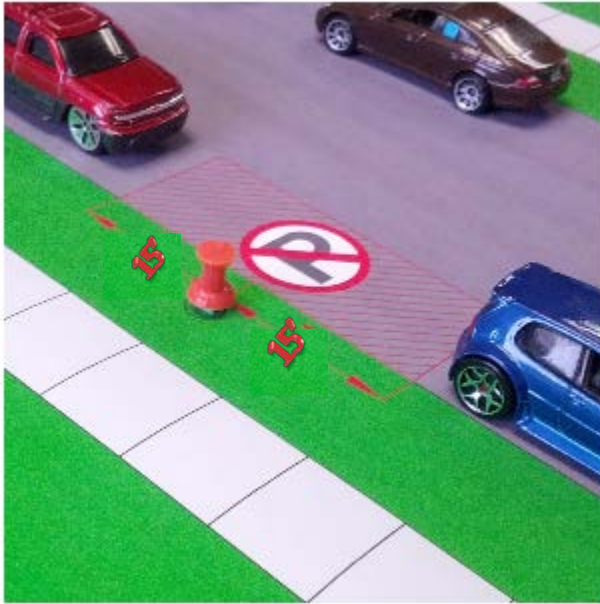
4. **No parking within 30 feet of signalized intersections.** It is illegal to park a car within 30 feet to ensure vehicles approaching the intersection can see the oncoming traffic on the other approaches.



5. **No parking within 20 feet of marked crosswalks.** Parking is prohibited within 20 feet of crosswalks to improve the ability of pedestrians to see oncoming traffic.



6. **No parking within 15 feet of fire hydrants.** This ensures that the fire department can easily access the hydrants in the event of fire.



7. **No parking within 5 feet of a driveway.** This space allows vehicles to maneuver in and out of the driveway.



8. **No parking within 10 feet of alley entrances.** This space allows vehicles to maneuver in and out of the alley.



9. **No parking for more than 48** consecutive hours in the same location.



**10. No Parking in a Handicapped Zone unless you have an authorized Handicapped Placard or Handicapped License Plate issued by a State Department of Motor Vehicles.**
