Investigators request the public's assistance to identify burglary suspects

July 9, 2019 (Highland Park, Texas) – Investigators with Highland Park Department of Public Safety (HPDPS) are seeking the public's assistance in identifying a residential burglary crew. Dating back to November 2018, HPDPS investigators have determined that at least five residential burglaries are connected in Highland Park. These burglaries occurred during the middle of the night, and in each case the home was occupied during the offense. Further, investigators have not found any evidence of forced entry.

The suspects sought in connection with the Highland Park burglaries have been determined to be responsible for eight additional offenses in the City of University Park. In total, this crew has been identified in thirteen residential burglaries, all of which were committed in the same manner. The community is being reminded that these burglaries are being committed by multiple suspects. The release of the still images is an effort by law enforcement to identify, locate, and arrest all suspects connected with these overnight break-ins.
